Jim Stewart and Jim Weuve have been working to complete the massive amount of paperwork and requirements for our church to be in compliance with AB506. California's Assembly Bill 506 (AB506) became law on September 16, 2021 and went into effect on January 1, 2022. This new law sets new requirements for youth serving organizations in three areas: screening, training, and policies. In addition, the law allows insurance carriers to seek verification of compliance with these requirements. Among other requirements are: live scan finger prints, regular mandated trainings, and 2 deep leadership where children are concerned. Jim and Jim both had to do Criminal Justice Security Awareness Training for Level 2 Security Awareness Certification, so they could qualify to be the COR (Custodian(s) of Record) – a required position - for our Church. At the Southern California Nevada Conference Annual Meeting in June, a new Conference Minister was appointed. Over the summer and through transitioning talks, it became clear to both the "new hire" and the conference that this was not a good match. The "new hire" has withdrawn from the position. Kris Bergstrom will continue as the Acting Conference Minister. A new Search Committee will be formed. Prayers for our Conference as they continue this journey.
